



My Story

“No cure. No hope. The prognosis was death — whatever years remained would be spent entirely on chemotherapy.”

A few years ago, I was diagnosed with stage-four terminal cancer. The cancer had spread to my back and leg, leaving me in constant pain and unable to walk, eat, or function normally. My left leg had folded and could not straighten. The doctors gave me four to six years — years I would spend on chemotherapy, not living. Those were the darkest days of my life. I had more surgeries than I could count.

During this time, as I began radiation and chemotherapy, I also began studying the Bible on healing. Through that study, I came to understand something that changed everything: God’s truth about healing. I claimed His promises. I repeatedly spoke aloud the Bible verses that contained those truths. Slowly, my health began to improve. My leg straightened. The pain subsided. My life turned around.

Today, there is no more chemotherapy. There is no more cancer.

I am sharing the truths I discovered — and the verses that carry them — in the hope that anyone facing a desperate situation may learn what I learned, come to know it as I know it, and hold on.

Truth 1 The Salvation and Healing Package

When Jesus died on the cross, He died for my sins and my sicknesses. The salvation deal and the healing deal are the same deal. He paid for both with His body and His life. I have been saved, and I have been healed.

When someone is prayed for and receives salvation, they do not necessarily *feel* saved — but that does not mean they are not. Healing works the same way. I may not feel healed, but I am healed. It has nothing to do with my feelings and everything to do with what Jesus did on the cross. As much as it is God’s will for every person to be saved, it is His will for every person to be healed.

“But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities; the chastisement for our peace was upon Him, and by His stripes we are healed.” — Isaiah 53:5 (NKJV)

“Or do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own? For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God’s.” — 1 Corinthians 6:19–20 (NKJV)

Truth 2 Redeemed from the Curse of Sickness

The Bible revealed to me that sickness is a curse, and that Jesus died to redeem me from that curse. Because of His sacrifice, I have been set free from the curse of sickness.

“Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the law, having become a curse for us (for it is written, ‘Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree’), that the blessing of Abraham might come upon the Gentiles in Christ Jesus, that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith.” — Galatians 3:13–14 (NKJV)

“If you diligently heed the voice of the Lord your God and do what is right in His sight, give ear to His commandments and keep all His statutes, I will put none of the diseases on you which I have brought on the Egyptians. For I am the Lord who heals you.” — Exodus 15:26

Truth 3 My Healing Is Timeless

God healed in the Old Testament. He revealed Himself as Jehovah Rapha — the Lord who heals (Exodus 15:26). Jesus healed everyone who came to Him in the New Testament. He heals the same way today (Hebrews 13:8). I am a living testimony of that.

“He also brought them out with silver and gold, and there was none feeble among His tribes.” — Psalm 105:37

“When evening had come, they brought to Him many who were demon-possessed. And He cast out the spirits with a word and healed all who were sick, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Isaiah the prophet, saying: ‘He Himself took our infirmities and bore our sicknesses.’” — Matthew 8:16–17

“And the whole multitude sought to touch Him, for power went out from Him and healed them all.” — Luke 6:19

“And whatever you ask in My name, that I will do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son.” — John 14:13

“The Lord is not slack concerning His promise, as some count slackness, but is longsuffering toward us, not willing that any should perish. . . .” — 2 Peter 3:9

I share this not as a religious exercise, but as a human one.

If you are facing something impossible — hold on.

These promises are real. I am the proof.
